

About Today's Service

Today's Music: The vocal soloist this morning is Emily Shallbetter. She sings two selections from a sacred song cycle by Czech composer Antonin Dvořák. This cycle sets a series of ten texts, selected from the Book of Psalms. Biblical Songs were written between March 5 - 26, 1894, while Dvořák was living in New York City. It has been suggested that he was prompted to write them by news of a death (of his father Frantisek, or of the composers Tchaikovsky or Gounod, or of the conductor Hans von Bülow); but there is no good evidence for that, and the most likely explanation is that he felt out of place in the bustle of a big city, and that, after two years in America, he was homesick for Bohemia.
